Seven literacy aides worked daily with small groups of students in kindergarten through 5th grade. Students in kindergarten through 2nd grade received take-home books every night for practice. These books were prepared by the literacy aides. Students in 3rd, 4th, and 5th grades received take-home books on an as-needed basis.
