# What systems will be put in place

- -one test per unit as opposed to weekly
- -progress monitor red and yellows (below and very below) twive a month as efficiently as possible to preserve small group insturvtion
- <u>-\*\*close reading is higher level questioning with the teacher to help students better understand a</u> passage. It's teacher guided reading.
- \*\*need is 7 reading interventionists. Cost is \$49,8000 from Land Trust money

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#### **MATH**

We went from 62%-69% as result of math lab and other efforts (example: backwards math

## School Climate goal

Attendance is lacking!

### To improve

- Teacher greet at doors
- Friendly competition with other classes
- Meaningful morning meetings that promote social skills and provide a warm and caring environment
- Realization that attendance does fall with mom and dad but trying to encourage kids to encourage mom and dad
- Goal is 90% by spring 2018 (that means 18 absences!!!)
- Monthly incentives for kids who have 1 or no abcensces or 2 or fewer tardies. Kids will be recognized every month in their class
- Our own incentive goals will be higher than the 90% goal
- Progress will be monitored monthly
- No land trust money required. It will come from principal supply budget
- SCC discussed importance of the incentive reflecting kids who were there for the whole day...not late not checked out
- For incentive- an absence is an absence same for tardy whether or not it was parent excused.
